March 2025 (following Provisional Monitoring review)

Accreditation-Provisional; Program demonstrates continued progress in complying with the *Standards* as it prepares for the graduation of the first class of students. The commission noted 3 areas of noncompliance with the *Standards*.

Next Comprehensive Evaluation: March 2027 (Final Provisional). Maximum class size: 40.

Report due May 17, 2025 (*Standards*, 5th edition):

- **Standard A2.03** (lacked evidence principal faculty is sufficient in number to meet the academic needs of enrolled students and manage the administrative responsibilities consistent with the complexity of the program)

March 2024

The program received an alert through the Program Management Portal that the number of students exceeded the maximum entering class size. The program submitted the required Exceeding Class Size report. The commission **accepted the report**. No further information requested.
